

Athlete Stipends, Support Programs and Benefits

UPDATED: December 2024

Eligibility Guidelines (Recurve)

To receive Athlete Stipends and/or Elite Athlete Health Insurance, recurve athletes must:

- Be a citizen of the United States and/or meet all World Archery eligibility requirements to compete for Team USA internationally and be able to, and actively working towards, meeting all eligibility requirements to compete for Team USA in the next Olympic Games;
- Be actively competing in the Senior Recurve division in domestic and international events (if eligible);
- Have a current USA Archery (USAA) membership;
- Have a current USA Archery Background Screen (if 18 years of age or older);
- Have a current U.S. Center for SafeSport Training;
- Be compliant with current USADA and WADA whereabouts standards and practices;
- Have signed Athlete Agreement on file with USA Archery for the current year;
- Commit to a program of preparation with the intent of qualifying for and competing in the next Olympic Games and attend all required domestic events, international events and or international prep-camps outlined in Appendix A;

Athlete Agreement: Elite Athlete Stipends and EAHI will only be provided to athletes who are currently training and competing in the same discipline they earned a national ranking the previous year. Each athlete recipient will be required to execute an agreement with the USOPC and will also be required to sign an Athlete Agreement with USAA, outlining the athlete's commitment with respect to a required training program, camps and events and compliance with USOPC and USAA policies and procedures. If an athlete fails to maintain a Senior recurve national ranking and/or does not participate in required events or camps (see Appendix A) or violates their athlete agreement, the Elite Athlete Stipend and EAHI may be eliminated, reduced or given to the next highest ranked athlete who meets the eligibility criteria, on a case-by-case basis, pending approval by USAA and the USOPC. Please note that USOPC Elite Athlete Stipends may increase or decrease from year to year, and the number of athletes supported may increase or decrease from year to year.

Athletes in the Resident Athlete Program, National Elite Program or Regional Elite Program will be required to sign a separate High Performance Program Agreement, which outlines the specific additional requirements, rules and expectations of each program, respectively.

- Pregnancy Clause: A recurve athlete who meets the eligibility criteria for EAHI and/or Elite Athlete Stipends at the time of pregnancy will continue to receive EAHI and/or the same amount Elite Athlete Stipend amount for the duration of the pregnancy, plus for an additional one-year period from the date of birth of the child or end of pregnancy, provided that the athlete remains eligible to receive the Elite Athlete Stipend and agrees that it is their intent to return to competition at an elite level. Receipt of these benefits shall not be conditioned upon any agreement that the athlete must continue to train during pregnancy or for the one-year period after the birth of the child or end of pregnancy. Upon the conclusion of the one-year period, the athlete will then have to requalify for EAHI and/or the Elite Athlete Stipend.
- <u>USADA Training</u>: Athletes are required to attend one FREE USADA online training annually. USA Archery will provide the online training schedule and athletes are required to self-register.
- <u>Suspension</u>: When a provisional USAA membership suspension has been imposed, the USOPC shall suspend and accrue Elite Athlete Stipend payments prior to a final determination of any violation.
 If an Elite Athlete Stipend payment has been accrued and the athlete is subsequently found not to have committed a violation, the Elite Athlete Stipend payment accrued shall be paid to the athlete.
 For EAHI, no consequences will occur until after a final determination of a rule violation has been found.

World Championship Year

January to May

The top four ranked archers, male and female, as of December 31st, 2024, in the USAA Senior National Rankings will receive an Elite Athlete Stipend from January to May (See Table 1.). Ties for the 4th place in the Senior National Rankings will be broken by the athlete's placement at the most recent USAA Target Nationals (Total Double 72 Arrow Round Score), followed by 10's and then X's at the same event. To maintain eligibility, athletes ranked in the top four (4) must participate in the World Archery Championships U.S. Team trials events and other required events (see Appendix A). If athletes are not actively competing and training, or they are eliminated from the 2025 World Archery Championship U.S. Team Trials process prior to the final nomination of the team, the athletes' Elite Athlete Stipend may be given to the next highest ranked athlete as follows: a. Before April 1 the stipend may be issued to the next highest ranked athlete based on the Senior national rankings as of 12/31/24 who meet the eligibility requirements, or b. After April 1 the stipend may be issued to the highest ranked athlete in the 2025 World Archery Championship U.S. Team Trials process who meet the eligibility requirements, on a case by case basis, pending approval by the USOPC.

Following the nomination of the 2025 World Archery Championship team June to December.

Following the conclusion of the final 2025 World Archery Championship U.S. Team Trials, the top three male and female recurve finalists nominated to the team will receive Elite Athlete Stipends June through December 31st, 2025 (See Table 3.) so long as they also meet the Minimum Qualifying Score (MQS) requirements set forth in Table 2.:

Table 2. The Recurve 72 Arrow Round MQS must be achieved at a USA Archery sanctioned national level event or world ranking event after January 1, 2024.

To maintain eligibility, archers must commit to training and participate in required events (see Appendix A).

If an athlete is ranked #1 through #3 but does not meet the MQS set forth in Table 2. Their stipend will not be paid, nor transferred to the next highest ranked athlete. Should the athlete achieve the required MQS after June 1, 2025, the athlete will begin receiving their Elite Stipend following the month of MQS achievement. Stipends will not be paid in arrears.

The Operation Gold qualifying event for USA Archery is the 2025 World Archery Championships, September 5 – September 12, 2025, in Gwangju, Korea.

In non-Olympic Games years, Operation Gold is limited to one award per athlete in the Term; athletes who qualify for more than one award automatically receive the higher award. Individuals must finish in one of the top eight places, while teams must finish in one of the top-six places at the qualifying event in a discipline on the program of the Olympic Games to qualify for an Operation Gold Award in a non-Olympic Games year. For the purposes of Operation Gold, a team is defined as three or more athletes (pairs are awarded at the same rate as individual athletes).

In addition to Elite Athlete Stipends and Operation Gold, the USOPC may provide eligible recurve athletes the following benefits (subject to change based on USOPC funding and/or other limitations):

Elite Athlete Health Insurance (Recurve Only)

Designated Team USA athletes are eligible to receive health insurance through the USOPC's Elite Athlete Health Insurance Program (EAHI). EAHI is a preferred provider organization (PPO) plan. For EAHI program information contact eahi@usopc.org.

EAHI Eligibility Criteria

EAHI will be offered, on or before January 31st to the top four eligible Senior recurve male and female athletes according to the Senior National Ranking System as of December 31st, 2024. EAHI will be available to these same athletes until May. Following the nomination of the 2025 World Archery Championship Team, EAHI will be offered to the top four recurve males and females per the final 2025 World Archery Championship U.S. Team Trials results June through December 2025.

Mental Health Assistance Fund (Recurve Only)

The USOPC will provide access to the Mental Health Assistance Fund (MHAF) per the eligibility criteria below:

- 1) All existing EAHI, National Medical Network (NMH), and USOPC mental health resources have been accessed and exhausted or deemed inappropriate.
- 2) Athletes who are training and have either been selected or are in contention to represent the U.S. at the next Olympic Games OR
- 3) Athletes selected to represent the U.S. in the past two years at an elite competition in an event (i.e. Outdoor World Cups, World Archery Championships, Pan American Championships, Pan American Games or Olympic Games) in a discipline included on the program at the next Olympic Games, and/or have been selected to represent the U.S. at a similar event in the current or next calendar year.

Eligibility Guidelines (Compound)

To receive Athlete Stipends, compound athletes must:

- Be a citizen of the United States and/or meet all World Archery eligibility requirements to compete for Team USA internationally and be able to, and actively working towards, meeting all eligibility requirements to compete for Team USA in the next Olympic Games;
- Be actively competing in the Senior Recurve division in domestic and international events (if eligible);
- Have a current USA Archery (USAA) membership;
- Have a current USA Archery Background Screen (if 18 years of age or older);
- Have a current U.S. Center for SafeSport Training;
- Be compliant with current USADA and WADA whereabouts standards and practices;
- Have signed Athlete Agreement on file with USA Archery for the current year;
- Commit to a program of preparation with the intent of qualifying for and competing in the next World Championships and attend all required domestic events, international events and or international prep-camps outlined in Appendix A;

Athlete Agreement: Athlete Stipends will only be provided to athletes who are currently training and competing in the same discipline they earned a national ranking the previous year. Each athlete recipient will be required to execute Athlete Agreement with USAA, outlining the athlete's commitment with respect to a required training program, camps and events and compliance with USAA policies and procedures. If an athlete fails to maintain a Senior compound national ranking and/or does not participate in required events or prep camps (see Appendix A) or violates their athlete agreement, the Athlete Stipend will not be provided and will be given to the next highest ranked athlete who meets the eligibility criteria, on a case-by-case basis, pending approval by USAA. Please note that Athlete Stipends may increase or decrease from year to year, and the number of athletes supported may increase or decrease from year to year.

Senior Compound Athlete Stipends

The top 3 ranked male and female archers in the National Rankings System in the Senior Compound Division will receive a \$3,000 athlete stipend for participation in each funded required international events as outlined in Appendix A, plus a \$500 travel stipend. If an athlete declines to participate in the funded required international event, the Athlete Stipends may be given to the next highest ranked athlete who meets the eligibility requirements up the 8th ranked archer in the Senior Compound National Rankings, on a case by case basis, pending approval by USA Archery and per the accept/decline process outlined in the Outdoor World Cup and other International Events selection procedures. If an athlete does not attend the international event no stipend will be provided.

NOTE: The 4th compound athlete named to each World Cup Team will receive a \$500 travel stipend only, however the following conditions will apply for additional stipend funding:

- a. If the 4th place compound places in the individual semi-final they will receive an additional \$3,000 athlete stipend after the conclusion of the event; or
- b. If the 4th place compound medals in the team or mixed team round they will receive an additional \$1,500 athlete stipend after the conclusion of the event.
 - a. Athletes must initially qualify for the team or mixed team round and not be added to the team(s) due to an athlete withdrawal.
- c. The maximum total compound athlete stipend will not exceed \$3,000.

Required Events

Required events and associated funding levels will be announced in January of each year and are subject to change each year based on the fluctuating event schedule, travel costs and yearly budgets (See Appendix A).

BENEFITS PROVIDED BY USA ARCHERY

United States Archery Team (USAT) Jerseys

USA Archery provides all athletes named to USAT two free jerseys annually.

USAT Retail Discounts and Benefits

Athletes named to USAT, may be offered retailer discounts and other equipment at a free or reduced cost. These benefits are subject to change annually, are not guaranteed and vary by team.

Short-Term Training Program (Recurve Only)

The Short-Term Training Program provides coaching and training access to athletes who desire to represent the U.S. at World Cup, World Championships, Pan American Games and/or Olympic Games and for whom USAA coaches believe are capable of achieving international podium success. Training sites are available in Charlotte, NC and Chula Vista, CA. Funding and program services vary by location. Please review the Short-Term Training Program Guide to learn more about the program and eligibility criteria.

Funded International Events and Camps

USA Archery will fund eligible athlete travel to international events and camps (hereafter, required events) as outlined in **Appendix A**. Funding may be provided for event registration, travel expenses (per the USA Archery travel policy), travel insurance and event uniforms.

Easton Foundations International Preseason Camp (Not Required): The top 3 Senior Recurve athletes and the top 3 Senior Compound athletes in the Senior national rankings as of 12/31/24 who meet the Camp Minimum Qualifying Score (MQS) will be invited to attend the camp with partial funding provided as outlined in Appendix A. If an athlete declines, this offer will be extended up to the 8th place Senior recurve or compound athlete in the Senior national rankings as of 12/31/24 who meet the MQS (a max of three athletes will receive partial funding per gender and division). All other athletes who meet the MQS requirements may apply to self-fund to the camp, so long as space is available.

Camp Minimum Qualifying Score (MQS)

To attend the camp the athlete must have achieved the Camp MQS (72 arrow ranking round score) within the past 12 months at a USA Archery sanctioned national level or sanctioned world ranking event.

• Male Recurve: 650 (70M Distance)

• Female Recurve: 625 (70M Distance)

• Male Compound: 695 (50M Distance)

• Female Compound: 680 (50M Distance)

High Performance Program Benefits

The USA Archery Athlete Agreement outlines additional obligations for athletes named to the United States Archery Team. Athletes in the Resident Athlete Program, National Elite Program or Regional Elite Program will be required to sign a separate High Performance Program Agreement, which outlines specific additional requirements of each program and related benefits, respectively.

^{*}Recurve and compound athletes must meet the minimum qualifying score set forth in the <u>World Cup</u> and <u>Other International Events Athlete Selection Procedures</u> to qualify for funding to the event, to include a stipend.

^{**}The 4th compound athlete named to a World Cup Team will be funded to the event and receive the \$500 travel stipend only. See Senior Compound Athlete Stipends section for exceptions.
