


In 2021, members and club members were asked to take a survey on how they think USA Archery is doing as a member-based association and as a leader in the archery industry.





GOLD MEDAL ASPIRATIONS?

Athletes with Para national or international archery aspirations need to go through a classification process. This process determines athlete eligibility and groups athletes according to their like abilities to create a level playing field. Athletes have the opportunity to earn a national rank by competing in USA Archery's Para United States Archery Team (USAT) series events. Athletes selected to Para USAT will have the opportunity to attend international events such as World Ranking Events and World Archery Para Championships. USA Archery also nominates teams to the Paralympic Games.

USA ARCHERY AGE CLASS UPDATES

One of the motions that passed at World Archery Congress was a proposal to change the official naming of age groups (from cadet, junior and masters, to U18, U21 and 50+).

The following are the available USA Archery Event Classes:

- **50+, 60+, 70+** Athletes may compete as a 50+, 60+, 70+ starting in the calendar year of their 50th birthday. 60+ and 70+ are only available for Recurve and Compound at Indoor and Target Nationals.
- Senior Athletes in the year of their 21st birthday, and older, will compete in the Senior class. Athletes of any age may compete as seniors.
- **U21** Athletes may compete in the U21 (formerly Junior) class up to and through the calendar year of their 20th birthday.
- **U18** Athletes may compete in the U18 (formerly Cadet) class up to and through the calendar year of their 17th birthday.
- **U15** Athletes may compete in the U15 (formerly Cub) class up to and through the calendar year of their 14th birthday.
- **U13** Athletes may compete in the U13 (formerly Bowman) class up to and through the calendar year of their 12th birthday.
- **Explorer** Male/Female combined for ages 14 and under. This option is only for local and state level events in basic compound and recurve divisions.
- Yeoman This class is for beginner youth members up to and through the calendar year of their 9th birthday. This class is not offered at National Events and is optional at state and local events. The outer 10-ring is to be used for Yeoman compound scoring.
- Para Athletes have to be <u>classified</u> before they may register in a Para Category. Archers who are not classified or who use assisitive devices, stools or service animals, are welcome to compete at USA Archery events in non-Para divisions.

Para Categories include:

- W1
- Compound Open combines W2 and Standing archers
- Recurve Open combines W2 and Standing archers
- Visually Impaired (V.I.)

The 53rd USA Archery Indoor Nationals and the 2022 JOAD Indoor Nationals are annual events that give thousands of archers the chance to compete at one of 13 convenient locations. USA Archery's Indoor events are a great way to get started in competing at the regional and national level.

Youth archers may compete in either or both the 53rd USA Archery Indoor Nationals and the 2022 USA Archery JOAD Indoor Nationals.

Senior and Master archers may compete only in the 53rd USA Archery Indoor Nationals.

Top 8 scoring archers in Recurve, Compound and Barebow are combined from all age classes and invited to the 2022 USA Archery Indoor Nationals Final. The 2022 JOAD Indoor Nationals uses scores of archers from all locations to determine the national champions.








KEVIN MATHER WINS PARALYMPIC GOLD AT TOKYO 2020

In his Paralympic debut, the Santa Clarita Valley native, Kevin Mather, won the Paralympic Champion title he's been manifesting for himself for years.

A lifelong athlete who played football in high school, Mather became paralyzed from the waist down after he was hit by a truck while training for a triathalon. Adaptive sports became a critical part of his recovery. He won the 2012 L.A. Marathon in the wheelchair division, competed at the national level in Para alpine skiing and eventually found Para archery on a whim.

His first archery event was the 2017 World Archery Para Championships - U.S. Team Trials, where he was named to Team USA and won silver in the team event at the Beijing tournament. From there, Mather began his quest for Paralympic gold. In one tournament, he broke five world records! Despite undergoing further surgery that set him back on his path, he never gave up.

In Tokyo, Mather qualified 17th, and after a strong 7-3 preliminary match win, he faced the top seed, Rahimi of India. Mather was up 4-0, Rahimi fought back for a 4-4 draw. They split the next set and it went to a shoot off. Mather shot first and could hardly have dreamt up a more perfect X under that pressure - he took the win and went on to the quarterfinals against Turkey's Savas.





There he met China's Lixue Zhao, who had knocked out USA's four-time Paralympian Eric Bennett in the 1/8th round in a heartbreakingly close match. With the pressure and stakes so high, Mather built yet another quick 4-0 lead, but Zhao fought back to a 5-3 score. Both drew 28s to end the match, but it was enough for Mather to garner his 6th set point and the champion title.

"I've got so much to do for the people that have supported me back home, there are so many people between friends, family, friends in the archery community," Mather exuded gracious gratitude after collecting his awards. "The archery community is so amazing and tight knit. It makes me really happy to be able to not only do this for myself, but to give them something back that we did it, we accomplished the task."

"I'm looking forward to coming back to the first shop I shot at with my gold medal around my neck and going like: 'hey guys, remember when I was that dweeby guy who couldn't barely keep it on the paper at 18 meters?""

Mather easily pulled ahead as he kept every single arrow golden for three straight sets to lead 5 - 1. Savas then fronted two 9s to Mather's two 8s before dropping an 8 of his own. Mather needed a 10 to win, which he was able to acheive.

In Mather's semifinal against India's Singh, the rain began to fall, but he was already sighted in and fighting hard. Mather opened up 28-25, then split the next two sets with Singh. Finally, Singh brought the match level at 4-4. Mather fired off a 10 and set the pace. He sealed his victory with a final 26-24 set for the 6 to advance to the gold final.

2022 UNITED STATES ARCHERY TEAM QUALIFIER SERIES

The United States Archery Team (USAT), established in 1982, consists of the top ranked male and female recurve, compound, barebow and fixed pins archers in the country. Archers earn national ranking points at USAT Qualifier Series Events, USA Archery Indoor, Outdoor and JOAD Target Nationals events, and USA Archery Field National events for barebow archers. Top ranked archers in each division are appointed to 50+, Senior, Para, U18 or U21 USAT.

USAT Qualifier Series Events are open to archers who are seeking national competition experience and want the excitement of competing alongside World Champions and Olympic medalists. These Events are held at different locations across the United States.

Competing in USAT events helps archers with aspirations to represent the U.S. at the Olympic, Paralympic and

World Championship levels measure their skill set and progress in competition at the national level.

In addition, USAT archers earn highly coveted uniforms to represent the U.S. in state, local and national competitions. USAT archers may also be eligible for athlete support programs, services and sponsor benefits.

While archery is one of the world's oldest sports, rooted so deeply in history, tradition, family and culture, it is still constantly evolving. We're always pushing the boundaries to get better, shoot more accurately, achieve higher scores and to grow and share the sport with the people we love. It's a passion and a way of life.

After the challenges of 2020, we saw triumph in 2021. On the world stage, Kevin Mather won the Paralympic Games, Brady Ellison and Jack Williams went head to head in several gold medal finals, and Williams won the Archery World Cup Final. Mackenzie Brown and Lia Coryell each finished 4th in Tokyo, and at 17 years old, Casey Kaufhold won silver at the World Archery Championships. Team USA's compound men returned to glory with their 8th world team title, shooting on home soil. Emerging youth talents shattered world records and topped podiums at the World Archery Youth Championships.



Here at home, we saw archers celebrate personal bests and state and national records, climbing through the USA Archery Achievement Award programs. State championship events are seeing all-time high participation with 40 states hosting events. USA Archery launched online coach certification programs, invested heavily in collegiate program and club growth through increased and improved grant offerings, and expanded education through our Virtual Symposium, which wrapped with a free session on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.

We're taking all of these successes and using them to fuel us to aim even higher.

OUR VISION

2022 is a year of opportunity, a chance to rebuild and to challenge ourselves. As we look to the future, USA Archery has sights set on the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games, the 2022 World Archery Para Championships, and the 2023 World Archery Championships and 2022 World Games, here on U.S. soil, along with many other prestigious events.

As we work towards a bigger, better, brighter future, USA Archery's top priorities as an organization tie to our mission, to enable United States athletes to achieve sustained competitive excellence in Olympic, Paralympic, World Championships and international competitions and to promote and grow the sport of archery. We are committed to our core values of integrity, leadership, communication, respect and excellence.

With the LA 2028 Games on the horizon, our vision includes building a robust pool of high performing athletes with clear and supported pathways for archers to achieve their dreams in the sport. USA Archery aims to inspire a generation, young and old, to enrich their lives through the art and practice of archery. We want to grow our membership with recreational and competitive archers who feel valued and appreciated. Archery should be a diverse and accessible sport where everyone is included. We want our events to give all attendees a positive experience. Fans should feel involved and able to follow from home as we grow awareness of the sport through mainstream media coverage. We're working to elevate USA Archery's reputation as a world leader in sport performance, coach and judge education, governance and sport technology.

YOUTH AND COLLEGIATE GROWTH INITIATIVES

We're expanding our national events to include barebow and youth fixed pins divisions and expanding our achievement award programs to include 3D archery, as well as developing state 3D championship events. This initiative will give collegiate programs the ability to recruit and develop competitive youth in these divisions and create a clear pathway to national and world 3D events. Collegiate varsity programs are at a new high with 25 schools supporting varsity teams and quickly growing new program development.

Additionally, USA Archery will look to expand pathways for adaptive youth archers by incorporating Para categories into JOAD Target Nationals and work toward offering the same in collegiate and State Championship events. This initiative will include additional opportunities for Para classification.



OUR MEMBERS COME FIRST

In 2021 we asked, and you answered! USA Archery sent its entire membership a survey, asking for your opinion on how we're doing, what we can do better and how to move forward into the future. We greatly appreciate your feedback and your input shaped our key strategies and direction for our plans through the LA28 Games. In the next several years, we will:

- Build better, more practical member and club benefits
- Streamline our registration and renewal processes, making it easier for you to navigate your archery, athlete and coaching careers
- Prioritize member experiences at events
- Communicate with you where you are, how you want to hear from us and what communications you want to receive
- Create a community USA Archery members feel they belong to and want to be a part of
- Provide value to each individual member through member benefits, event experience, training and education offerings and so much more





USA ARCHERY IS OPEN TO ALL

USA Archery strives to be an organization that is free of prejudice, actively promotes equal opportunities, provides diversity training and employs a diverse team. We have recently adopted our first Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Access Strategic Plan, which outlines our priorities through 2024. Our goals involve updating USA Archery business practices to include policies, procedures, publications and digital content to reflect our vision for a diverse, equitable, inclusive and accessible organization, to recruit and retain a board of directors, committee members and staff that are more balanced and reflective of the population in the United States, to develop outreach, marketing and communication objectives to increase diversity in our membership, athletes and coaches and to increase funding USA Archery dedicates to DEIA initiatives.

COACH'S PERSPECTIVE: WHAT CAN ARCHERS DO TO AIM HIGHER?

USA Archery National Head Coach KiSik Lee reflected on the team's performance in Tokyo and shared his insights on how high-performing archers can and should prepare as we move forward into the next Games cycle and beyond.

- Archers should practice intense technical and mental training with a strong focus on the process, not the result. I cannot overstress the importance of mastering the process without focusing on results. If you can master the process, results will come. In fact, one can gain competitive mental strength only through intense focus on the process itself, not by repetitive physical motion alone. Power of visualization is very effective in achieving mental and technical strength. It is vital.
- Maintain a strong daily discipline, prepare with a professional mindset and think outside the box. Don't be afraid to take risks. There is no shortcut; we need to intensify preparations more now than ever to achieve success in the next Games. To my athletes, I say, "Every evening ask yourself did I do enough today? What did I miss? Am I satisfied with my effort today? If the answer is no, then revisit your plan for tomorrow". Every second counts for Olympic success.
- Watch the level of your competitors and make sure you're training to achieve that level. Be committed to growth and self-development through continuous observation, reflection, and experimentation.



ATHLETES' PERSPECTIVE

Olympian Jack Williams won the 2021 Archery World Cup Final to cap an incredible season that included World Cup and World Championship podium finishes:

"With the new strategic plan, we are hoping to grow the depth at the elite level and have many full-time professional archers. I hope that this will allow kids to aspire to be professional archers, similar to how they might look towards professional basketball or football athletes for inspiration with their sport. What's driving me to continue in the sport is the ability to travel the world and win World Cups for Team USA. I'm striving to be a professional archer and hoping to grow the sport for other archers to do the same."

Paralympian Eric Bennett is seeking another shot at the World Para Champion title and hopes to see his first Paralympic gold in what would be his 5th Games:

"My goal is to win the Paralympic championship in Paris. I've been at this a long time, but I know I still have what it takes. World champs in '22 and '23 are my practice runs for victory in Paris. I am so excited for the future of the US para archery team. We have a solid group of athletes currently and have many up and coming athletes working on getting in the game. While we continue to develop our pipeline, we are also working on developing a plan to make our elite athletes even better. No joke, world domination is our goal."

Up and coming cadet compound archer Sawyer Sullivan won gold at every USAT event in 2021, including JOAD Nationals, while shattering world records in back to back competition days:

"In 2017, I was 13, I shot in Lansing, Michigan at my first Youth World Trials. My parents and I decided I should just shoot it for experience. I stood next to all these amazing archers. I was in awe of their talent and their kindness. I finished second to last in that tournament. USA Archery took an amazing team to Argentina that year and I followed scores, watched them win medals and set my sights on making the team one day. I am not going to lie, there were days it was hard. There were days I didn't want to shoot. There were many, many days that I felt like I was never going to reach that goal. To all the young archers out there, don't give up. Fight for it. Work for it. And most importantly, it's not about winning, medals, and trophies, it's about the moments, the memories, and the people."

Jennifer Mucino-Fernandez made her Olympic debut in Tokyo at 18 years old, finishing 17th but hungry to return and do even better:

"I want to keep growing as an archer so one day I can fulfill my goal of winning an Olympic medal while inspiring others to pursue their dreams. I have been part of this sport for almost 10 years in two different countrie;, I have participated in a lot of competitions and played countless matches, and it all started with a dream when I was 9 years old. So, all I can say is, if you have a dream, pursue it. If you want to try archery, try it. You might be the next Olympian, but you will never know if you don't start somewhere!"

Two-time Paralympian Lia Coryell wasn't sure she'd make it to the Tokyo Games, but she battled numerous health challenges and is still slinging Xs on her mission to leave a legacy in the sport:

"My personal motto is Adaptive Archery allows for everyone to have time on the line and nobody shoots alone. I like to remind my students, athletes and fans that archery is a sport that accepts people who look different, talk different, who may think differently than them and yet it's important to include ALL people because everyone deserves to shoot and have fun."

STRATEGIC VISION



A working group of board members, athletes, coaches, staff leaders and other stakeholder representatives met October 9-10, 2021 to draft strategic priorities for USA Archery to guide organizational focus and success through 2028.

With the vision for the future in mind, and after reviewing current and future state issues, USA Archery will focus on four key areas to address the most pressing challenges and opportunities ahead. These are not intended to encompass the full scope of our activities; rather, they represent the highest priorities for the organization to achieve between now and 2028 to ensure the vitality and success of our organization and our ability to advance our mission.

The key "pillars" for strategic success by 2028 are:

- » **MEMBERSHIP PATHWAYS:** Enhance avenues for sport entry and lifelong participation, maximizing member growth, retention and overall experience.
 - Pathway "Roadmap". Prioritize and articulate the key pathways from initial participation to membership and stakeholder engagement, ensuring gaps between introductory programs and club/ event participation are minimized.
 - **Grassroots Growth.** Grow base participation in the sport through quality programing and safe and inclusive environments. Focus will include Diversity and inclusion, LA28, Member Experience, and Athlete Safety & Well-being.
 - **Coaching.** Increase the number of quality coaches, leading to a better experience and increased athlete retention rates, providing more opportunities for growth and development.
- » **ORGANIZATIONAL EFFECTIVENESS.** Strengthen capabilities and capacity to enable greater connectedness and support for our mission, values and strategic priorities.
 - **Strategic Communications.** Coordinate access and dissemination of information with identified customer needs and preferences to enhance member and stakeholder experience (easier/faster/more relevant) and drive greater awareness and understanding of organizational services and resources.
 - **Celebrate Community.** Foster a strong sense of connectedness and respect among USA Archery members, staff and stakeholders by "telling our story" of amazing accomplishments, inspiring journeys, and inclusiveness of diverse people, abilities and life experiences.
 - **Culture of Excellence.** Align behavioral expectations, actions and organizational values to enhance trust and confidence across the entire archery ecosystem, from grassroots to high performance, and inclusive of athletes, coaches, judges, volunteers, administrators, parents, partners, etc.
 - **Revenue Expansion.** Create and monetize opportunities to engage non-traditional audiences and partners, thereby growing interest, appreciation and revenue.



- » PIPELINE AND HIGH PERFORMANCE. Reinforce the high performance pipeline to achieve and sustain competitive excellence with increased support and coordination of transitions across all levels of development.
 - Paralympic Engagement. Expand Paralympic archery with an emphasis on reducing barriers for entry, increasing recruitment, improving talent identification and growing opportunities for classification.
 - Development Programs and Pathways. Enhance and support programs that lead to youth and postyouth elite performance. Increase education, outreach, and awareness of pathways to becoming an elite archer.
 - **Collegiate Archery.** Elevate the partnership with collegiate archery programs to serve as a systemic and predictable high-performance pipeline. Enhance the connectivity and coordination between precollege competition, through collegiate ages and programs and national team opportunities.
 - **Elite Archery Professionalization.** Introduce more avenues of earning opportunities for elite athletes during their competitive career to support competitive excellence and sustained engagement with USA Archery and the sport.
- » **EVENT OPTIMIZATION.** USA Archery sanctioned events are consistently well-run, enjoyable, and technologically advanced experiences for participants and fans alike.
 - **Consistent Customer Experience.** Establish and reinforce best practices for delivery and management of USA Archery-associated events.
 - **Event Ecosystem Strategy.** Strategically review the current USA Archery event ecosystem and develop plan to target event locations to increase sport awareness, create more growth opportunities, be more accessible to all participants and spectators (both physically and with more participant slots), and generate fan excitement.
 - **Event Technology.** Integrate innovative technology into event delivery to create additional efficiencies and optimize in-person or virtual participant, spectator and fan experience.


VISION FOR DIVERSITY, EQUITY, INCLUSION AND ACCESS



USAT SELECTION PROCEDURES

The USA Archery Field Nationals varies from the traditional format shot at most other USA Archery events. Field archery is typically shot in a natural setting with uneven terrain and natural obstacles. The course is made up of unmarked and marked rounds for Recurve, Compound, Barebow and Fixed Pins divisions.

The National Field Archery Association is headquartered in historic Yankton, South Dakota. Situated on nearly 100 acres, the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center includes three outdoor field ranges, a 3D range with a 40' elevated platform, two FITA ranges, a 90m indoor range, two classrooms, a fitness studio, indoor tennis courts, and indoor air rifle.




The USA Archery Collegiate Target Nationals is where students represent their school while competing against other colleges and universities across the country.

USA Archery's Collegiate Archery Program provides students enrolled in a college or university the opportunity to participate in national competitions while providing a community that helps with the stresses and pressures of rigorous academic pursuits. This varsity or club program gives college students the perfect outlet with friendships that last a lifetime.

Eligible participants can work to develop fundamental skills, compete for individual and national team championships and earn Academic and All-American awards. Collegiate Archery Programs can be varsity teams with scholarships, club sports or student organizations on campus.

Choose your path in the Collegiate Archery Program with recreational and competitive opportunities for barebow, recurve, compound, and fixed pins divisions. Archers coming from a Junior Olympic Archery Development (JOAD), National Archery in the Schools (NASP), Olympic Archery in Schools (OAS), or Scholastic 3-D (S3DA) program can continue their archery journey. Students with little or no archery experience are also welcomed to learn about and fall in love with the sport.

COLLEGIATE ELIGIBILITY

Student-athletes become eligible to compete in the Collegiate Archery Program by being a member of an existing team or as an individual where there is not yet an archery program at the school.

Collegiate Eligibility requirements:

- Current USA Archery Member (Temporary, Recreational and Trial Memberships excluded).
- Enrolled full-time at a two- or four-year college or university.
- Member of the existing school Team or individual student if no Team exists.
- Maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 for undergraduates and 3.0 for graduate students.
- Apply within the approved 7 years of eligibility.

ACADEMIC YEAR

All participants are required to have current Collegiate Eligibility with USA Archery to participate within a USA Archery Sanctioned Collegiate Event.

Eligibility period for the 2021-2022 school year will run August 1, 2021-July 31, 2022. A graduating archer is no longer eligible to compete in the collegiate division at sanctioned events beginning the term after they graduate (example: archers graduating in the fall term are not eligible to participate in the spring term as a collegiate archer).



To participate, archers must be a member of USA Archery and meet all collegiate eligibility requirements.





NOVA ARCHERY AND FENCING CLUB



The Nova Archery and Fencing Club in Fairfax, Virginia is also a registered USA Archery Junior Archery Development (JOAD) Club and offers Explore Archery, youth and adult archery lessons in addition to fencing lessons in one facility. Created in 2015, the club has quickly become one of USA Archery's largest clubs with more than 200 active members!

Coach Greg Kaidanov has been involved in the sport of fencing for almost his entire life, both as an athlete and as a coach. Nova Fencing Club, a USA Fencing member club was started by Kaidanov in a temporary space at the Falls Church Episcopal. In just one year, they grew large enough to move into a permanent space, and in 2020, the club signed a lease for a new larger facility, which doubled their square footage to 10,000 square feet, with range space designated for archery.

In 2019, one of their club fencing coaches, who had previously coached archery with the Girl Scouts helped the club make the decision to add archery to their offerings. The club began small, by adding archery to their summer camp offerings and started to offer Explore Archery classes on the weekend with USA Archery Level 2 instructor Paul Dainauskas. During 2020, archery played a pivotal role in the sustainment of the club as the demand for archery classes and lessons increased. They pivoted to Explore Archery half-day camps after fencing camps were cancelled.





"Archery and fencing take nearly the same amount of space, and archery doesn't run much of a risk of damaging the fencing scoring equipment, so the two activities can utilize the same facility pretty easily," commented Donna Felsenheld, General Manager of the Nova Archery and Fencing Club.

"We decided to have an archery club to create a dual income stream. Often new athletes are interested in both fencing and archery, but typically only stick with one, because of the time commitment or cost". Felsenheld added, "Archery has helped to grow our overall club membership. Additionally, archery has been useful as a dual sport option for some of our fencing athletes because it doesn't require a huge investment to participate at the recreational level, and they enjoy the benefits of archery."

With their new 10,000 square foot building, Nova has included a permanent archery target wall and created a seven-lane range with adequate social distancing between lanes. The club has also worked to advance their archery coaching by partnering with USA Archery Level 4-NTS Coach Dean Villanueva, and Coach Dainauskas advanced to a USA Archery Level 3-NTS certification.

"Our larger coaching staff and facility allows us to have Virtual Indoor archery tournaments and we are looking forward to hosting in-person sanctioned events in the upcoming Indoor Archery season," commented Felsenheld. "We have used USA Archery's Achievement Awards to mark our archers' progress and help sustain interest."

Felsenheld added that: "One of the many benefits of adding an additional National Governing Body affiliated sport club, such as USA Archery, are that all coaches are U.S. Center for SafeSport trained, have a current approved Background Screening and an understanding of how to properly develop athletes recreationally or competitively."


The 138th USA Archery Target Nationals and U.S. Open is held for adult (Senior and 50+) archers in the recurve, compound and barebow divisions.

DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

The Regional Elite Development Program and the National Elite Development Program were established to identify and develop high-performing athletes to represent the United States of America in both U.S. and World competitions. These programs give athletes the opportunity to train, with their peers and personal coaches, throughout the year at various regional camps and/or national training centers under the direction of regional or national head coaching staff.

PROGRAM MISSION

To develop athletes, through the USA Archery (USAA) athlete competencies and High Performance Ethos, who are nationally and internationally competitive.

PROGRAM STANDARDS

As a member of the Regional or National Elite Development Program, athletes are expected to develop skills to be competitive at the national and international level. Athletes and their personal coaches will also be expected to take a professional approach to their training and to work with the Program Coaches to set goals for proficiency training.

NATIONAL ELITE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The National Elite Development Program will provide selected recurve athletes access to the Easton Archery Center of Excellence while continuing personal archery training to be internationally competitive. The Program will provide athletes access to the Easton Archery Center of Excellence in Chula Vista, CA led by the USAA National Coaching Staff, a custom training plan, virtual coach support and access to online trainings to further development within USAA's athlete competencies.







Athletes will be provided a minimum of 7 funded bed nights at the Easton Archery Center of Excellence in Chula Vista, CA and will be eligible to request additional self-funded user nights through USAA's short-term training program. U18 athletes will be provided opportunities to attend up to 3 camps. Athletes will be expected to train at the same level as Resident Athletes during approved training times at the Easton Archery Center of Excellence and both the athlete and their personal coach must be willing to work with the national coaching staff.



Athletes in the program are expected to maintain a high level of training despite attending school or work. It is recommended that athletes shoot a minimum of 1,000 arrows per week while training at home. Athletes are also highly encouraged to participate in USAA local and state sanctioned events and to participate in at least in one International event (self-funded or funded) per calendar year to gain international tournament experience including performance under pressure.

REGIONAL ELITE DEVELOPMENT (RED) PROGRAM

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The RED Program is designed to develop recurve and compound athletes ages 13 - 17, through the USAA athlete competencies and High Performance Ethos, who are nationally and internationally competitive. The program includes 3 - 4 self-funded regional camps per year, which are 2 - 4 days each and include both recurve and compound athletes. Athletes and their personal coaches must be willing to work with the RED Program Coaching staff.



Athletes in the program are expected to maintain a high level of training despite attending school. It is recommended that athletes shoot a minimum of 300-600 arrows per week while training at home. Athletes are also highly encouraged to participate in USAA local, state and national USAA sanctioned events to gain tournament experience including performance under pressure.



These competencies provide a road map for developing quality coaching for both recreational based clubs and clubs focusing on high performance.
